F O R E W O R D

IT IS TIME TO MOVE TO THE NEXT LEVEL

The more you bear the burden of leadership, the more you realise that people, and not things, events or places, matter the most. This places on you a demand to place your people and their welfare at the heart of your leadership.

But since things, events and places exert a profound influence on people, you also find yourself obligated to improve them for the benefit of your people. Therefore, my definition of good governance is the ability to unite the people, things, events and places within your leadership space in a wholesome, symbiotic relationship.

When approached with this mindset, governance ceases to be a popularity contest and becomes a life-saving vocation requiring the leader's best efforts always. Our governance objective in Kogi State since January 27, 2016 when my New Direction Administration assumed the helms in Kogi State is to do the right thing for the present generation and for posterity without fear or favour.

And over the last 47 months that we have been in office, we have adhered to this principle. Nothing has been about the next election - it has always been about the next generation.

If we were overly concerned about elections and sweetening the populace with empty tokenism, we would have acted very differently. Instead, we have stepped on toes and ousted vested interests which compete with the overall best interests of the people.

In spite of widespread misunderstanding of our reforms in the early days, and even in the face of a vicious and vociferous opposition, we have persevered in our determination to change how government business is perceived and conducted in Kogi State. Our institutional reforms have become so systemic - in government itself, in the civil service and throughout our body politic for anyone, no matter how narrow-minded or short-sighted, to overturn without a fight from Kogites themselves.

Today, everyone can see the difference and the benefits of courageous leadership for themselves. Contrary to efforts, often by well-meaning but sadly miseducated folks, to persuade us that the people will only understand the old ways, the vast majority of Kogi people at the grassroots, and at all levels, have shown great appreciation of the difficult path we have had to tread to bring Change home.

This understanding has become even clearer and the support more overwhelming over the last few weeks as we campaigned for reelection from Kogi East to Kogi West to Kogi Central. We have been welcomed in community after community, and from door to door, with an incredible outpouring of goodwill.

It also helps that as we get closer to the November 16 date for the 2019 Kogi State Gubernatorial Elections, the Deputy Governor and myself, along with our party people and other supporters are campaigning for a second term with a strong suite of achievements justifying our first term. In presenting this manifesto, it is important that I seize this occasion to highlight some of the governance records that we have set during this first term.

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Upon taking Office, we quickly identified the need to govern by a set of globally recognised principles which are both measurable and scalable. The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) which had come into use just about 4 months before I was sworn in were perfect for this purpose. In addition to the SDGs, we found the United Nations/Oxford University Poverty and Human Development Initiative, known as the UN/OPHI Multidimensional Poverty Index (MPI), to be a compelling guide.

I then recruited a multidisciplinary team of consultants to help us develop a governance blueprint which reflected our intents and purposes. This team blended the fundamental essences of the SDGs and the MPI with the harsh realities we met on ground in Kogi State to distill a citizen-driven governance roadmap which we called the New Direction Blueprint.

The real world application in Kogi State of the development paradigms contained in the New Direction Blueprint immediately became both our mission and preoccupation

from the moment we launched it in mid-2016. I must admit that administering a policy document founded on strange principles, no matter how lofty, has been intensely disruptive. When you take governance outside the familiar forms which people have become used to, such as stomach infrastructure, and try to institute long term, but more enduring, practices there is bound to be resistance.

However, with perseverance, I am now able to attest that as the new approaches slowly matures, they have turned out to be very rewarding. For instance, in September 2017, less than 2 years into my tenure, Kogi State was one out of only 4 states in the federation deemed success stories in the SDGs by the United Nations. We were invited to share our methods at the 72nd United Nations General Assembly in New York, and we did.

Security of lives and properties is easily the area in which we made the quickest and most measurable progress from the beginning. We inherited a Kogi State that was the kidnap capital of Nigeria with over 250 kidnap cases in 2015 alone. Less than 6 months into my tenure, those terrible numbers dropped by over 90%. In fact, for a 6 month period from July of 2016 to early January of 2017 we recorded no kidnap cases at all. Till today, kidnapping has remained an isolated and mainly opportunistic crime in Kogi State.

In 2018, in addition to earning awards for excellence in security governance from key security agencies, we were rated the 2nd most peaceful state in the federation after Osun, and the most peaceful in northern Nigeria by the National Peace Index (NPI). Kogi State under my leadership was in the same 2018 rated the state with the second lowest crime statistics after Kebbi by the National Bureau of Statistics (NBS).

Once notorious as a hotbed of armed robbery, communal clashes, home invasions, political thuggery and other violent crimes, we rapidly became the national poster boy for peace and security of citizens. The secret of our award-winning security architecture is really simple. We spent funds appropriated for security to actually provide security for the people.

Part of what we did included purchase of over 200 brand new patrol vans and 500 motorcycles, also new, for distribution to all the security agencies operating in the state. We also supported them with modern communication gadgetry and provided finances and logistics. In addition, we built a Forward Operations Base for the Nigerian Army from scratch and established smaller outposts for other agencies across the state.

Kogi State was a highly polarised society when we arrived Government House. There was a general belief that access to government was the preserve of a section while others took the crumbs. The result was mutual distrust along tribal, religious and class lines. It fell to us therefore to exemplify inclusiveness from day one. We have again acquitted ourselves excellently in this regard.

For the first time since Kogi State was created we have enjoyed equity in the spread of government appointments and projects. When it comes to appointments, everyone knows that Yahaya Bello only looks for merit, equity, fairness and justice in selecting and placing persons who work with him. In like manner, projects are distributed to ensure proportionality among all constituencies in the state.

Tribe, religion or class are no longer the determinants of who or where gets what. They play no role except as a measure of proportionality. We have also made it a deliberate policy to carry the youth and the womenfolk along. For the first time

in our history, they occupy the largest number of high profile positions in government and wield real influence.

Our Internally Generated Revenue has grown from about N350m monthly to over N1bn every month now, mainly by the elimination of waste and corruption and by improving collection. Our IGR figures since 2016 are in themselves a metaphor for the steady development which we stand for. We have grown from N9,569,123,755.23 in 2016 to N11,244,260,974.75 in 2017 to N11,334,113,743.58 in 2018 and N11,574,226,904.31 as at August, 2019.

This 2019, the World Bank Group declared us the top performer in World Bank projects portfolio in the country. This highlights our efforts in health, education, environment and sanitation, public service reforms, physical infrastructure, open government, disaster management and others. It bears repeating that since we took Office I have been intentional about meeting Kogi State's counterpart funding and other partnership obligations - to the World Bank Group and to all other international and domestic development partners.

Still in 2019 we rank the 7th top performer among all the states and FCT in basic education funding according to the records of Universal Basic Education Commission (UBEC). We have renovated, or constructed from scratch, over 375 basic education schools across the state and supplied learning materials.

Our secondary schools and Tertiary institutions have enjoyed serious attention from the administration, both in provision of enhanced learning materials and physical infrastructure. As a result, several Tertiary institutions such as the Kogi State College of Nursing, Obangede, were able to receive critical accreditations which have remained elusive for years.

Still in 2019, the Nigerian Bureau of Statistics rated us one of the only 9 states which reduced unemployment at a time the rest of the country slid further into it. This rating in particular discredited those who shouted up and down that our civil service reforms were a waste of time and without objective.

Even the vexed issue of non-payment of salaries and pensions have become history as I was finally able to fulfill my promise to pay before they become due. In August, and again in September, I paid our workers even before the month ran out. Henceforth, it is our plan, based on arrangements we have worked out with our financial institutions, that salaries and pensions will be paid from the 25th of every month.

I must commend the forthrightness of Organised Labour in Kogi State which has refused to allow those aspirants who want to play politics with payment of salaries to do so. In this regard, I am glad to make reference to Labour's press release on Friday, November 1, 2019 clarifying again the true position on payment of salaries to Kogi State workers by my Administration.

In the statement jointly SIGNED on behalf of affiliate unions by Comrades Onuh Edoaka and Ranti Ojo, chairpersons respectively of the Kogi State chapters of the Nigerian Labour Congress (NLC) and Trade Union Congress (TUC), Labour stated as follows:

'As at today, the general position is that most workers have been paid up to October 2019 at the state level. They, however, held that Local Government staff, primary schools teachers and pensioners were still expecting their October 2019 salary and pension.'

Let me state that payment to the outstanding category of workers is ongoing and I do believe that before this Manifesto

is presented, all Kogi State workers would have received their October 2019 salaries.

We have also taken tremendous strides in the provision of physical and engineering infrastructure and utilities of all types. Identifiable hallmarks of my administration include major link and township road networks, electricity projects, rural water schemes, primary and secondary healthcare centres, specialist health programmes and empowerment initiatives for youths, women and other sections of our populace.

We have delivered electricity to over 200 communities across the state, especially in the Eastern flank and the Lokoja/Koto axis of Kogi West. On July 6th, I inaugurated the Project Light Up Kogi East (PLUKE) for accelerated electrification of at least another 200 communities in Kogi East.

We have built from scratch a 50 tons per day capacity rice mill at Ejiba in Yagba East LGA of Kogi West Senatorial District. It is functional as we speak. The mill is currently supported with about 800 hectares of cultivated rice, already harvested. In the years ahead we will continue to scale up the land under cultivation. The mill will also serve as an off-taker for paddy farmed by many of our farmers. As time goes by, the mill and its ancillaries are estimated to provide between 3000 to 20,000 direct and indirect jobs respectively.

One project that is particularly dear to my heart is the Government House Chapel. We did the groundbreaking in July alongside the National President of the Christian Association of Nigeria and other clerics. We are on target to commission it by the end of this year. I feel gratified that a jinx of 28 years has been broken and we have brought balance and religious harmony in this small but significant manner.

Once notorious as a hotbed of armed robbery, communal clashes, home invasions, political thuggery and other violent crimes, our award-winning security architecture came at the cost of a Governor actually spending his security vote and other appropriated funds on the provision of security for his people.

Our partnership with the federal government has also proven to be very critical in bridging some gaps for us. Kogi alone received 6 roads in the first phase of the road for tax initiative under Executive Order 7. I am also pushing for quick intervention of the FGN on the Lokoja-Okene and Ajaokuta-Itobe federal roads. I have reason to believe that work will commence on them soon.

This is a manifesto and we cannot go into exhaustive details on policies and projects. I am glad to refer everyone to our Referral Compendia of Achievements for 2016, 2017 and 2018 respectively for more information.

Once, while speaking about the SDGs, Ban Ki-moon, the former United Nations scribe poignantly said, 'We don't have plan B because there is no planet B.' Similarly, my Administration has operated in Kogi State with the attitude that we do not have another state, or a better time to get things right than the one we have right now.

That is why I have approached you, the good people of Kogi State, for the second and final term of my tenure to enable me consolidate and finish strong on the work at hand.

Accordingly, in this Manifesto I present to you the logical next steps for accelerated and proportional development of Kogi State in all her constituencies and demographics.

Finally, I call on all Kogites to troop out on November 16 to vote for the APC and all her candidates with the promise that upon reelection (by the grace of God and the goodwill of our People), our next Blueprint document will encapsulate and elaborate on this Manifesto. Moreover, I solemnly undertake that I and my running mate, Edward Onoja, will make it the primary passion of our government to transform these promises into living reality.

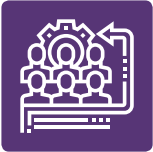
